NEWS FROM THE OFFICE

CSEF FUNDING – Important Notice!

The Department of Education & Training has an annual payment which replaced the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA). This is known as Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF). CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities to the value of \$125.00 per student.

If you received CSEF payments last year, and your circumstances have not changed, you do not need to fill in the CSEF form. Your details will rollover to 2021.

If you are a new recipient of a means tested concession or pension card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for the CSEF. Please come to the office and complete the CSEF application form and show your card to office staff. Please ensure all return applications are returned to the office no later than Friday 25th June—end of Term 2. Late applications will not be accepted.

Year 6 Camp: PYP Focus



The Year 6 Canberra Camp was another roaring success in 2021.

Our students came back with a wealth of knowledge about how our system of government operates and the power we, as citizens, have because we live in a constitutional democratic nation, such as Australia. This was made possible thanks to the fantastic educators and volunteers who guided us through Parliament House, Old Parliament House and the Australian Electoral Commission.

We were also taken to the many significant landmarks and places in Canberra, with visits to the CSIRO Discovery Centre, the Australian Capital Exhibition, the Royal Australian Mint, Deep Space Communication Complex, the Australian War Memorial, the Telstra Tower and the Australian Institute for Sport (AIS). Each of these visits showcased many different elements to our nation's capital, offering fun and exciting activities. Some, including Sportex, where students tested their athletic abilities through simulations and games; Questacon where students were amazed by all the phenomenal experiments and areas of science and the amazing view from Telstra Tower. Standing 195 metres above sea level, it's Canberra's highest point.

One of the most significant moments of our trip was being able to pay our respects to our past and present soldiers through a very special poppy laying ceremony at the Australian War Memorial. Our School Captains took part in an additional ceremony, laying a wreath and writing a special message thanking the soldiers for their sacrifice. At Parliament House we were able to see the House of Representative and the Senate and to learn about the structure of the Australian Federal Government System.


We would like to thank The Australian Government who recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$45 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

Well done to all the students who attended camp. They were excellent representatives for our school, always showing respect to everyone they met whilst we were in Canberra.

Recorders ordered through Compass portal should arrive at school by mid March.







Personal Responsibility

Taking responsibility - the mark of leadership!

Personal responsibility is the mark of true leadership. However shirking responsibility or shifting the blame to others is a national sport in many western countries.

"Its not my fault" can be heard in court rooms, political rallies and in sporting tribunals everywhere as blame for a transgression is shifted away from the individual and placed on a scapegoat. It is little wonder that many children are experts at shirking personal responsibility.

Lack of personal responsibility is shown when children find excuses or blame others for their misbehaviour. It is shown when siblings are blamed for starting fights, parents for children's school lateness and classmates for misbehaving at school. Anything or anyone but themselves is to blame!

"Its not my turn" is another way of shirking responsibility.

Most parents want their children to be responsible for their actions. Taking responsibility means that a child sees a problem and fixes it. A child who takes responsibility helps out regardless of how many times they have helped before or who causes a situation.

When a child complains that the toilet roll is empty then he or she can be invited to take responsibility for it. Similarly, if the bread bin is empty, the fire is out or the living room floor is a mess then the message could be that they should 'do something' about these situations.

When a child is late for school, forgets to hand in homework or deliberately hurts a classmate



even though some teasing occurred then he or she needs to shoulder the blame and take responsibility for their actions.

Sounds tough but this is the approach to take if we are to promote a true sense of responsibility, initiative and accountability.

In families some children become adept at ducking their responsibilities. It is smart management to share the load using rosters and other organisational strategies.

But in the myriad of informal situations around the house where someone needs to take responsibility then it is helpful to take the "don't tell me, please fix it" approach.

Next time a child responds to your request for help with that classic line "but it's not my turn" look them straight in the eye and say, "You know, you may be right but isn't it lucky that you are so willing to help" and simply walk away. No buts, no arguments.

PRACTICE

To promote personal responsibility in your child:

- 1. Help them identify BUT NUTS and BLAME **GAMERS**
 - · BUT NUTS look for excuses such as tiredness, moods or other people when things go wrong. "BUT I am too tired to help."
 - · BLAME GAMERS blame others when things go wrong. "It's not my fault. Sarah started it."
- 2. Make sure they have some jobs at home so that others rely on them.
- 3. Use a roster for jobs and place responsibility on children to do tasks without being reminded.
