# Changes people experience at different stages of their lives affect their evolving sense of self

During Term 1, students in Year 5 used multiple skills across a variety of subject areas to explore our central idea in a transdisciplinary way. While learning the concepts of time and data representation, students created some amazing daily life graphs that exhibited a typical day for them. They used art and thinking skills to produce beautiful silhouettes that displayed their sense of self. Students reflected on their physical and relationship changes throughout their life as part of their work in P.E. They used their ICT skills to create a digital display about themselves. These explorations culminated in students using their oral and written communication skills to present their digital display to their classmates.


