

PYP focus in Year 6 - Sharing the Planet

Whilst looking into our central idea of 'Local and global communities share the responsibility to look after the planet', the Year 6 students inquired into what global warming is and how greenhouse gases and the use of fossil fuels affect our planet. Students went through the design process to create an alternative way to generate electricity in Australia. Here are some of the amazing projects the students presented.

Waterfall Turbine Water Recycler by Henry, Tom and Denilson

The way our idea works is that water comes through the top path, creating momentum. The water then falls down the edge of the lane and spins the turbine that is placed under the falling point, creating kinetic energy and feeds it to the converters. The converters change the kinetic energy into mechanical energy, which still isn't usable. The mechanical energy is then sent to a generator which does the last step of converting the mechanical energy to electricity. This is now ready to be sent out to data centres and be sold to consumers. A portion of the energy is kept as a power source of a couple of vital pumps in the waterfall. Back to the mechanics of the machine, the water is then lead towards the pumps that push the water back up towards the top path. This is a way to reuse the water that has already been used to spin the turbine so no water is



wasted. Once the water is pushed back to the top path, it re-enters the cycle of the waterfall and continues to spin the turbine.

Solar Panel Vehicles by Julian, Thomas and Declan



We explored installing solar panels on vehicles such as planes and trucks. We decided to construct two models consisting of cardboard to act like metal and black coloured plastic which acted as the solar panels, to put this together we used a hot glue gun. We struggled with the materialisation of our choices we tried to make our first design using paper and tape, although it looked wonky and did not go to plan so we scratched the idea and thought of our master plan.




Carbon Dioxide Recycler by Emily K, Hana-Joy and Leilani

For our Sharing the Planet project, we had to invent something to help our planet. Our design was that we would attach a pipe to the end of a car's exhaust pipe, which is connected to a small 'Carbon Bubble' underneath the car. The carbon dioxide would flow from the exhaust pipe into the pipe then through into the carbon bubble, which it would be temporarily stored in until you emptied into a 'Carbon Recycler', (a small structure containing trees and



bushes) conveniently located near a gas-station. Once you have attached the 'carbon bubble' to a pipe leading into the 'carbon recycler' the carbon dioxide would eventually get 'recycled' into oxygen through the plants process of photosynthesis. The benefits of this invention is that it prevents the Co2 from being released into the atmosphere helping to reduce the rates of global warming.

Small Change, Big Difference

If you have any unwanted foreign currency lying around at home, please consider bringing it to the office where it will be donated to the "Small Change, Big Difference" program established by UNICEF.

What is Small Change, Big Difference?

The Small Change, Big Difference programs allows individuals to donate their unwanted and unusable foreign coins to support UNICEF's work saving and protecting children around the world.

We believe that right now, there is approximately \$832m worth of foreign coins lying dormant across Australian homes and offices. With just over 8 million dwellings in Australia, that's an average of over \$100 in foreign currency in each.

Most people believe that their few dollars, rupees, baht or euros is not enough to make a difference, but when AUD\$1.75 is all it takes to feed a malnourished child for a day – you can help to save a life by giving to UNICEF what many think might be "useless" foreign coins.

Travel Money Oz and UNICEF have united to establish collection points for unwanted foreign coins, so that you can make a big difference with your small change. UNICEF collects coin from any country and can convert it into meaningful work to help children, especially those most disadvantaged and hardest to reach.

You can deposit your foreign coins at any Travel Money Oz outlet in Australia and donate today.




UNICEF Australia works with partners such as Travel Money Oz to collect and manage the donations of foreign coins. UNICEF, through existing systems, relies on the collection and processing of this 'unwanted' foreign coins and converts it into real, meaningful work for children.

How unwanted foreign coins can help

On average when a person donates their foreign money, they give over \$17 per donation, but even the smallest amount can have a profound impact on giving a child the chance to survive and thrive:

- 1UK penny will provide a child with clean drinking water for one day.
- 65 Euro cents can provide a child with a pencil and book for school.
- Two New Zealand dollars will provide a severely malnourished child enough therapeutic super food for one day.
- 272 Indian Rupees (roughly \$4 AUD) can provide an insecticide-treated malaria net to a vulnerable family.
- 243 Thai Baht (roughly \$9.50 AUD) will provide 20 doses of life-saving measles vaccine.
