The PYP at AGPS: Year 6 Strawberry Experiment



This term, the Year 6 students have been working on the unit of inquiry, 'How the world works' by examining science through experimentation. They have been learning how to communicate effectively using the scientific report method and have conducted a number of experiments during class to fuel their inquiries.

One exciting experiment the students conducted was comparing strawberries washed in water with strawberries washed with an aloe vera

solution to see how mould would develop. The students came up with many interesting questions about what could possibly happen, and each student wrote up their own hypothesis and observed

the strawberries over a five day period.

The results were quite astonishing and the students wrote detailed observations and then formed conclusions about what had happened. They also reflected on what other variables they could use if they conducted the experiment again.

The one conclusion made by all of Year 6 was definitely that an inquiry into science is great fun!


